Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council General Meeting Minutes September 20, 2011

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. by Chair, Gary Schumacher.

Introductions were made of all present.

The minutes were read and approved as written.

The Treasurer's report shows that the council has \$806.38 in our checking account with no expeditures.

Stormwater

Our guest speaker, Meredith Noble from Wastewater Management, showed us some photos of the algea bloom in Liberty Lake in 1976.

The Clean Water Act was enacted in 1972 and amended in 1977 to regulate pollutants going in to the lake. Non-point pollutants come from an entire watershed and that accounts for 60% of water pollution. Stormwater pollution comes from rain or snow runoff. The runoff picks up ground pollution, such as pet waste, and it gets into our water.

There are catch basins to catch debris as they go into the city sewer system.

Grassy swales are good to catch water and deposit into the dry well to seep out.

She intoducted us to the Spokane Urban Runnoff Greenway Ecosystem. This is proposed to be located between the curb and sidewalk and will capture, treat and infiltrate stormwater runoff.

On Broadway, from Elm to Oak, there is an urban green space. This improves air quality and moderates summer temperatures.

One way to improve on stormwater quality is through education. Some things we can do to help are:

- Wash or cars, bikes, etc on our lawn
- Let no waste water run in to the street
- Use less fertilizers
- Check for leaks under our cars
- Don't dump waste down storm drains
