You are invited to help beautify the South Hill **Froggy Pond** area. This 5-acre area has a couple distinct climates – one has vernal ponds with lush water-loving foliage. The other part, which we plan to improve, is dry, weedy, with a smattering of hardy native plants. We will be improving the dry area with the addition of native plants, bushes and deer-resistant bulbs: juniper bushes, golden currant, nine bark serviceberry, mock orange, iris, lilacs, daffodils. **Please come help us dig in the plants.**

If you would like to donate bulbs, we'd love to have them. The most deer-resistant are: daffodils, snowdrops, crocuses, iris. Tools to bring to the gardening project include:

- Bulbs or rhizomes that you wish to donate
- Garden rake
- Shovel
- Trowel
