General Meeting Minutes
March 19, 2013

The meeting was brought to order at 7:30 p.m.

Community Assembly Report

Marilyn Lloyd reminded us that on Monday the 25th, there will be a City Council Town Hall Meeting at 6:00 p.m. at the East Central Community Center. Everyone is invited. Gary Schumacher will be presenting for Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council.

Planning

Our application for our "Traffic Calming" is finished. We have asked for speed signs at the pedestrian crossing on 29th, in front of Rosauers and one on 27th, in front of Thornton Murphy Park. Originally, we wanted to put a "Hawk Sign" there, but none are available at this point.

Bob Turner suggested that 2 little traffic circles, just the width of the street, may slow traffic down. Sally talked to residents and property owners near the park and got very positive feedback, including Vandervert, who owns the business center.

Our City Councilman, Jon Snyder, told us that the neighborhood planning for business centers has gone backwards with the new administration.

The business center at 29th and Regal is being looked at for multi-use buildings and a transit hub.

There was a question about the City waiting for STA to do their planning??? Jon did not know but would check in to that and let Sally know.

Comp Plan

Dr. Sonneland's land in Quail Run, just west of SE Blvd extension, is included in our comp plan changes. It looks as though some multi-use buildings are being planned for there.

The Southeast corner of 29th and Fiske is also on our comp plan for changes.

Alton's/Tire Rama own that corner and there is no time frame or plans at this time.

Terrill Black has asked if Scott Chesney could come to our May meeting. Yes, Sally will let her know that he is invited.

South Hill Coalition

The coalition has hired MIG to take over planning for phase 2 of the project. MIG has experience working with the City of Spokane and seem very excited to join us in planning. MIG is currently working on the Scope of Work.

Neighborhood Clean Up

The clean up is scheduled for May 11th. Gary Schumacher is the chair again this year. He will contact the Sheriff's Department to get a work crew again this year. Last year it worked out very well.

Gary also has dump passes, good for 3/23 to 4/5. They are worth \$40 each. Anyone who would like some can get them from him tonight.

School District 81 is helping with communication in our neighborhood. They have interns that work in the District 81 office and attend running start in college. They are helping Marilyn and Sally work on setting up a Twitter account.

Gary and Colleen Dennis have resigned their positions with our council, effective April 30, so Sally will post on our website that a new Vice Chair and a new Secretary/Treasurer are needed.
