What is SEPA?

- Adopted in 1971 to mirror the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969
- Often the *only* mechanism of environmental review for projects in the state
- Consists of agency review, public notification, public comment, and issuance of a determination.
- Applicable to both project and non-project actions



What types of project actions require SEPA?

- SEPA Checklist
- Site Plan
- Geotechnical analysis
- Traffic Impact Analysis and/or Trip Generation Letter
- Wetland Studies (if applicable)
- Wildlife Studies (if applicable)

Neighborhood Notification


