Resolution for Traffic Calming at Ray/23<sup>rd</sup>  
Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council

WHEREAS the Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council voted on 3/17/26 at their scheduled meeting to support a request for traffic calming at SE Blvd/25<sup>th</sup> Ave and Ray/23<sup>rd</sup>.

WHEREAS several residents of the Rockwood South Hill retirement community have met and discussed the hazardous traffic concerns at the two points of ingress/egress, a major safety concern for the residents. Mayor Lisa Brown and city council members Paul Dillon and Kate Telis got an email from resident Tom Mosher on 2/5/26 citing their concerns

WHEREAS the Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council has received numerous complaints about the speed of traffic on SE Blvd, lane striping, and the necessity for a traffic study.

WHEREAS A mobile speed feedback sign was placed on S SE Blvd and E 25<sup>th</sup> Ave capturing northbound traffic from 8/25/25 to 9/5/25. Although the statistics are not considered 100 percent accurate it does 100 percent support a history of traffic concerns at the location.

WHEREAS an 83-year-old retired teacher, was struck and killed by a vehicle while walking on the sidewalk near SE Blvd/25<sup>th</sup> on 7/17/2020.

WHEREAS the safety of bicyclists, pedestrians and vehicles is a necessity on SE Blvd. The arterial connects Lincoln Heights, Rockwood, East Central, and Southgate neighborhoods.

WHEREAS traffic calming on Ray/23<sup>rd</sup> will keep the ingress/egress turn point at Rockwood South Hill retirement community safe and enhance the safety of our Cycle 14 funded PHB at the intersection of Ray/23<sup>rd</sup> or Ray/24<sup>th</sup>

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council supports a prioritization of traffic calming, including construction and/or quick build, at SE Blvd/25<sup>th</sup> and Ray/23<sup>rd</sup>.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council also supports and appreciates its residents submitted concerns on this location to 311.
